FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME AT SFS NARENGI

St Francis De Sales School, Narengi organized a Faculty Development Programme from 25th to 31st July 2018 in collaboration with Indian Institute of Technology, Guwahati. The objective of the programme was to equip the teachers with 21st century technological skills. It was a six-day programme, spread over three phases. The first phase of the training was on information communication tools (ICT) led by Mr Saumyajeet Chowdhury and Mrs Lavanya Rao from Hyderabad. The first two sessions were based on ICT tools which inspired and motivated the teachers to implement the tools effectively in class.
